What is a Forward head posture? A Forward head posture is where the position of the head is in front of the mid line of the body. (Ideally – the ear canal should be aligned with the mid line of the torso.)

Types. Poor posture can present in several ways: It can present with rounded and elevated shoulders and a pushed-forward head position. This position places stress on the spine between the top of the neck and skull and the base of the neck and upper shoulders.
